City Issues Amended Emergency Directive to Reduce Spread of COVID-19

EL PASO, **Texas** – Today the City of El Paso amended the City's emergency directive in accordance with guidelines issued by the state and federal government, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to further mitigate the spread of COVID-19.

The following order will go into effective at 11:59 p.m. tonight, March 20, and will remain in effect until April 3, 2020:

- Order No. 1: In accordance with the Guidelines from the President and the CDC, every person in Texas shall avoid social gatherings in groups of more than 10 people.
- Order No. 2: In accordance with the Guidelines from the President and the CDC, people shall avoid eating or drinking at bars, restaurants, and food courts, or visiting gyms or massage parlors; provided, however, that the use of drive-thru, pickup, or delivery options is allowed and highly encouraged throughout the limited duration of this executive order.
- Order No. 3: In accordance with the Guidelines from the President and the CDC, people shall not visit nursing homes or retirement or long-term care facilities unless to provide critical assistance.
- Order No. 4: In accordance with the Guidelines from the President and the CDC, schools shall temporarily close.

The directive does not prohibit the public from visiting a variety of places, including grocery stores, gas stations, parks and banks, so long as the necessary precautions are maintained to reduce the transmission of COVID-19.

For offices and workplaces that remain open, employees should practice good hygiene and, where feasible, work from home in order to achieve optimum social distancing.

Municipal Court to Close for In-Person Services

Action to Protect Public from Evolving COVID-19

EL PASO, Texas – In response to the COVID-19 pandemic and for the safety of the public and City of El Paso employees, the El Paso Municipal Court will be closed to the public for in-person services starting Monday, March 23, until further notice.

All court hearings, sessions and jury duty at all bond office locations will be suspended during this time. The court will reschedule and notify residents who have scheduled trials, hearings or jury appearances by mail with a new time and date.

In addition, Municipal Court activities such as Juvenile Case Management Classes, Youth Delinquency Prevention Classes, and Teen Court will be suspended.

While Municipal Court facilities remain closed, residents can still conduct business with the court online or by phone. Residents are encouraged to resolve their citation(s) through the following methods:

Police Implement Modifications in Response to COVID-19 Threat



In an effort to address on-going concerns surrounding the presence of COVID-19 in the EI Paso Police area, the EI Paso Police Department is implementing modifications to our response protocols. Dispatchers will now ask health and travel related questions to individuals requesting Police response. Dispatchers may provide callers with specific instructions regarding their interactions with Police, to include maintaining a social distance of at least six feet from officers. Citizens are strongly encouraged to utilize on-line and telephone reporting options to file Police reports when Police response is not paramount. The EI Paso Police Department will continue to provide the same high quality service that has exemplified our department for decades. We ask for the public's patience and

cooperation in our effort to maintain the safety of both citizens and officers in this trying time.

International Ports of Entry

New Restrictions for Crossborder Travel at El Paso Ports of Entry

To reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19, El Paso Mayor Dee Margo is supporting a decision by the federal government to limit travel along land ports of entry connecting the United States and Mexico to "essential travel."

"We are one region dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic; therefore, it is imperative that as a region we restrict unnecessary travel and personal contact," Margo said. "At this time I believe the Federal limitations applied to our bridges will still allow for commerce and essential business to be conducted."

Homeland Security plans to restrict travel into the United States through land ports along the U.S-Mexico border to "essential travel." The restrictions will begin at 11:59 p.m. EST on March 20, 2020 and will remain in place until April 20, 2020.

"Essential travel" includes (but is not limited to):

- v U.S. citizens and lawful permanent residents returning to the United States
- v Individuals traveling for medical purposes (e.g., to receive medical treatment in the United States)
 - v Individuals traveling to attend educational institutions
- v Individuals traveling to work in the United States (e.g., individuals working in the farming or agriculture industry who must travel between the United States and Mexico in furtherance of such work)
- v Individuals traveling for emergency response and public health purposes (e.g., government officials or emergency responders entering the United States to support Federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial government efforts to respond to COVID-19 or other emergencies)
- v Individuals engaged in lawful cross-border trade (e.g., truck drivers supporting the movement of cargo between the United States and Mexico)
 - v Individuals engaged in official government travel or diplomatic travel
- v Members of the U.S. Armed Forces, and the spouses and children of members of the U.S.
 - v Armed Forces, returning to the United States
 - v Individuals engaged in military-related travel or operations

The following travel does not fall within the definition of "essential travel" for purposes of this Notification:

v Individuals traveling for tourism purposes (e.g., sightseeing, recreation, gambling, or attending cultural events).

The City of El Paso manages southbound lanes at the Paso Del Norte, Stanton and Ysleta/Zaragoza ports of entry. The southbound lanes will continue to operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

South bound lanes at the ports of entry managed by the City of El Paso remain open to travelers crossing into Juárez, Mexico. Travelers are encouraged to limit their travel into Mexico to "essential travel," and to stay vigilant of travel notifications issued by Mexico.


SBA Loan Application Now Available

Today, Governor Abbott <u>announced</u> that the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) has now granted Texas' Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) assistance declaration, making loans available statewide to small businesses and private, non-profit organizations to help alleviate economic injury caused by the Coronavirus (COVID-19).

Next Steps: Small businesses who believe they may be eligible for an SBA EIDL should visit the <u>SBA's website</u> where they can directly apply for assistance. The online application is the fastest method to receive a decision about loan eligibility.


District 7 Weekly Street Resurfacing Report

They learn how to secure various sources of income and a permanent

fulltime job, to manage their time and budget to have quality time with their children, to make use of community resources and private counseling and to enroll their children in family health clinics to insure continued preventive health care without resorting to hospital emergency rooms. The staff remains available and alert to the needs of every family that has transitioned to their own home, especially during the first year of transitioning, thus obliterating obstacles that might lead to another episode of homelessness.



Submit a Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP) Application!



The City of El Paso's Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP) addresses concerns primarily related to safety as caused by vehicle traffic on neighborhood streets. The NTMP includes a formal application and process for the implementation of traffic calming measures in El Paso neighborhoods and a toolbox of those traffic calming measures.

Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP)
Application

All of the following criteria <u>must</u> be satisfied for a street to be considered eligible for Physical Measure installations.

Petition

A petition that documents that 66% of the residential households abutting the street support traffic calming installations.

2. Uses of Street

The uses on the street where the physical measure is proposed must be composed primarily of low density residential dwellings.

3. Operational Characteristics of the Street

- a. The street must be used to provide access to abutting residential properties (local residential street) and/or to collect traffic for such streets (residential collector).
- b. There must be no more than one moving lane of traffic in each direction.
- c. Traffic volumes must be more than 500 vehicles per day but less than 7,500 vehicles per day.
- d. Fifteen percent (15%) of traffic meets or exceeds five miles per hour (MPH) over the posted speed limit
- e. The street must have a speed limit of 20-35 MPH as determined in accordance with State Law.
- f. A crash rate that is at least 25% above baseline rate (may substitute for Criteria 3d)*

4. Geometric Characteristics of the Street

- a. The street must have adequate sight distances to safely accommodate the traffic calming device.
- b. The street must not have curves or grades that prevent safe placement of devices. Traffic calming devices may be located on streets that contain curves and/or grades, but the device itself must not be located within a horizontal curve, on a vertical grade greater that 8% or on their immediate approaches.
- c. The street must be paved. It there are no curbs, a special design must be used to prevent vehicle runarounds.
- d. The elevation of property adjacent to a physical measure location must be above top of curb to minimize potential flooding due to the presence of the traffic calming device in the roadway.
- * Based on collision patterns, speed cushions may not be the appropriate option to address the issue. Other safety solutions, outside of the NTMP, may be considered and implemented by the





Innovating Recycling Improvements:

Changes to Recycling Collection Schedules



Innovative recycling improvements are on their way to our Curbside Recycling Program.

When the blue bins were first distributed in 2007, our program lacked a mechanism for tracking the rate at which customers set out their bins and other vital metrics for evaluating the effectiveness of the service. As a result, recycling collection trucks

have been running routes where less than half of the bins are set out for collection, and the majority of those containers placed on the curb are less than a quarter full.

We now have the data to make impactful service improvements. Our new processes will enable us to deliver a more efficient recycling service to our customers.

Recycling collections will shift to every other week collections starting in March 2020, as data shows more than half of customers consistently choose to not place their blue bins out on a weekly basis. Customers will see improved on-time recycling collections through the new operational efficiencies, less wear and tear on streets, and expanded solid waste services.

The improved recycling operations will result in significant savings that will be invested in expanding and enhancing Citizen Collection Station services. These sites, conveniently located within neighborhoods throughout El Paso allow our customers to dispose of bulky waste, such as furniture, extra trash, and hazardous household waste at no cost.




